OUTREACH

COPA—HELPING US MAKE A DIFFERENCE!

Do you have concerns about healthcare, the economy, housing, public safety and gangs? Do you feel powerless to have any real impact on these huge problems facing us all? Come and learn about COPA, Communities Organized for Relational Power in Action, which was started by Resurrection and other parishes of the Diocese of Monterey along with other faith communities and community organizations. We created COPA to help us as individuals and various communities to come together and address these challenges which affect us all. We have a monthly parish COPA team meeting on the first Sunday of each month (this month moved to July 11 due to the July 4 holiday). If you'd like to learn more about how COPA can help you make a difference, come the parish meeting this Sunday, July 11 at 11:30 AM in the church conference room (behind the altar).

PRISON & JAIL MINISTRIES COLLECTION...Next weekend, July 17 & 18, we will have a second collection for our Prison & Jail Ministries. "When I was in prison, you visited me." Our parishioners visit the incarcerated Christ in several ways. We provide a weekly communion service at the county jail. We participate in weekly ecumenical centering prayer at Salinas Valley prison in Soledad. We also provide Christian Hope retreats each year at the Soledad prisons. We also help family members visit their incarcerated relatives through the Get On the Bus program. Your generous support will help us to continue to provide these very effective ministries. Studies show that inmates who participate in ministries like these are more likely to lead successful lives when they are released. Christ thanks you!

GABRIEL PROJECT... The Gabriel Project is an ecumenical movement of churches committed to helping women and families in crisis pregnancies. The church community helps meet the mom's emotional, spiritual and material needs. - A couple living in their car are both disabled and need housing (they have SSI income).

- A handyman is looking for any kind of work—no job too small!
- A woman is looking do some part-time house cleaning work.

The socks they own are likely to be wet, worn out and dirty, causing their feet become blistered and infected. Clean socks guard against illness and provide warmth when temperatures dip.
